



Subject: AGENDA ITEM: Request for City Attorney to Advise the City Council on Legal Issues Related to Allowing Casino Type Gambling Within the City of Long Beach

BACKGROUND

The City of Long Beach is a prime tourist location in need of a steady source of revenue to support the public services and infrastructure of a city its size.

California has seen an explosive growth and acceptance of casino-type gambling over the past ten years that has resulted in millions of dollars of needed revenue for both the State and the local jurisdictions where these casinos are located.

Long Beach should not pass up the opportunity to add to its "tourist spots" a first-class, casino that could potentially provide a source of revenue that will allow the City to meet its obligations to provide first class public services and infrastructure to its residents.

There are a variety of legal issues that must be addressed for Long Beach to move forward with this concept that must be presented to the City Council for its review and decision.

RECOMENDATION:

It is requested by the City Council that the City Attorney provide a memorandum outlining the legal issues that need to be addressed in order to allow casino-style gambling within the City of Long Beach. Should the City Attorney advise that this issue requires the vote of the residents of Long Beach, then it is also requested that appropriate language be prepared so that this matter can be placed before the voters at the City's next general election to be held in February 2008,

While, I look forward to learning the legal issues related to legalized gambling within the City of Long Beach, I am withdrawing Agenda Item 22 at this time so that there is no inference that the City Council has taken a position on the preferred use of the property on or adjacent to the Queen Mary. While, agenda item 22 specifically does not discuss the Queen Mary, it is possible for the topic to arise during discussion at the August 21, 2007 Long Beach City Council meeting.

Given the fact that we are about to begin negotiations, which will define the nature of any future development on the property encompassed in the Queen Mary lease, I think it is premature to publicly discuss specific options.

Again, I look forward to the future conversation, and legal opinion from the City Attorney, related to legalized gambling within the City of Long Beach.
