

**CERTIFICATION AND PUBLICATION OF  
CERTIFIED RESULTS IN LOS ANGELES TIMES**

I, Troy Abercrombie, herby certify that:

1. I am a certified public accountant in good standing in California and a principal of Talley & Co. (“**Talley**”). I supervised election work for the Gabrielino-Tongva Tribe, a California Indian tribe historically known as San Gabriel Band of Mission Indians (the “**Tribe**”). Talley conducted the vote count and certification for the Tribe’s Spring 2007 Election (the “**Election**” and the 5 “**Offices**”).

2. Talley conducted the Election strictly in accordance with the Agreement Governing Election Procedures For Spring 2007 Tribal Council Elections For The Gabrielino-Tongva Tribe, entered into between Talley and the Tribe (the “**Agreement**”). All Election records and all Talley records from conducting the Election remain available at the Talley offices, in case of challenge.

3. Talley used the Tribe’s Spring 2007 List of Registered Voters to determine the validity of ballots cast. Only Class B adult members of the Tribe and Class C adult members of the Tribe were entitled to vote and only their votes were counted in official results. Therefore, members of other political groups different from the Tribe were not included.

4. Only properly marked ballots were counted in official results. Only ballots received after voting opened and only ballots received before voting closed were counted in official results. All valid ballots received in a timely manner under the Agreement were counted and tabulated.

5. Talley hereby certifies the following official election results:

***Ratification of Constitution***

Ratification of the Constitution received 106 votes, or 99%, of Class B votes. Class B votes against ratification totaled 1 vote, or 1%. Ratification received 74 votes, or 100%, of Class C votes. Class C votes against ratification totaled 0 votes, or 0%.

Ratification received a total of 180 votes, or 99% of the 181 votes cast. The vote against ratification was 1 vote, or 1% of the 181 votes cast.

As a result, the Constitution was duly adopted and ratified by vote of adult members of the Tribe, all in accordance with Articles XVII and VII, §5 thereof.

***Office 1***

Linda Candelaria received 108 votes, or 100%, of Class B votes. She received 75 votes, or 100%, of Class C votes. She received a total of 183 votes, or 100% of the 183 votes cast for Office 1.

According to the Constitution and the Tribal Election Ordinance, Linda Candelaria is duly elected to Office No. 1.

***Office 2***

Susan Rodriguez received 108 votes, or 100%, of Class B votes. She received 75 votes, or 100%, of Class C votes. She received a total of 183 votes, or 100% of the 183 votes cast for Office 2.

According to the Constitution and the Tribal Election Ordinance, Susan Rodriguez is duly elected to Office No. 2.

***Office 3***

Bernie Acuna received 107 votes, or 99%, of Class B votes. He received 74 votes, or 99%, of Class C votes. He received a total of 181 votes, or 99% the 183 votes cast for Office 3.

According to the Constitution and the Tribal Election Ordinance, Bernie Acuna is duly elected to Office No. 3.

***Office 4***

Martha Gonzalez received 108 votes, or 100%, of Class B votes. She received 75 votes, or 100%, of Class C votes. She received a total of 183 votes, or 100% the 183 votes cast for Office 4.

According to the Constitution and the Tribal Election Ordinance, Martha Gonzalez is duly elected to Office No. 4.

***Office 5***

Laurie Salse received 107 votes, or 99%, of Class B votes. She received 75 votes, or 100%, of Class C votes. She received a total of 182 votes, or 99% the 183 votes cast for Office 5.

According to the Constitution and the Tribal Election Ordinance, Laurie Salse is duly elected to Office No. 5.

***Ballots Cast***


There were 288 registered Class B adult voters. There were 108 ballots validly cast by Class B adults, or 38% of Class B adult voters. There were 518 registered Class C adult voters. There were 75 ballots validly cast by Class C adults, or 15% of Class C adult voters.

There were a total of 806 registered voters. There were 183 ballots validly cast, or 23% of registered voters. According to Article VII, §5 of the Constitution and the Tribal Election Ordinance, the election was valid and validly held.

There were 130 ballots received by Talley for Class B adults, whether or not valid. There were 22 duplicate ballots, or a total of 17 % of the ballots cast, for Class B adults.

There were 79 ballots received by Talley for Class C adults, whether or not valid. There were 3 duplicate ballots and 1 ballot otherwise not counted, or a total of 5% of the ballots cast, for Class C adults.
